- Residents are encouraged to share their comments!

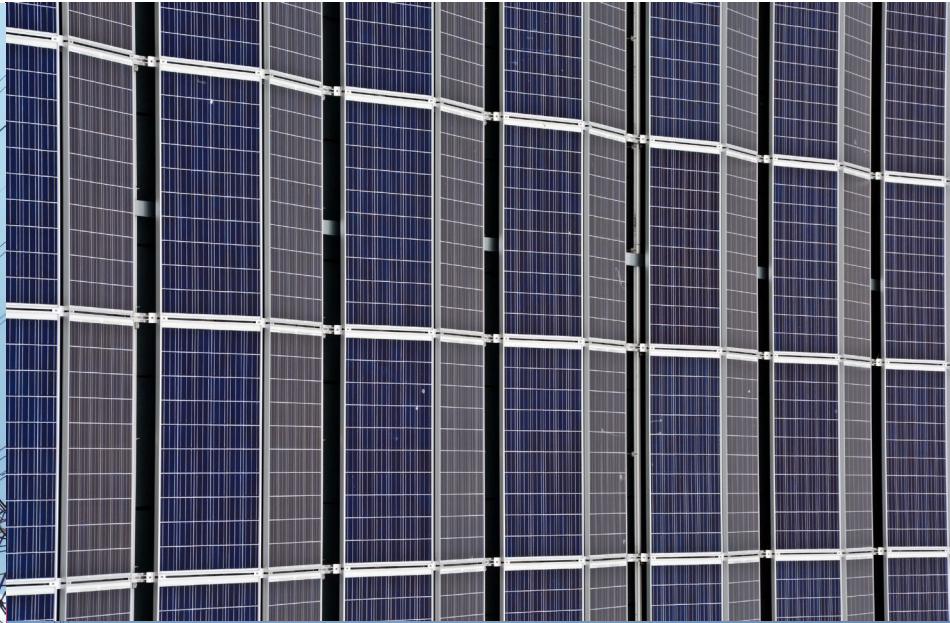

Congratulations! I'm pleased to let you know that the City of Bremerton is receiving \$2,068,230 in PSRC funding for the following project:

The projects are part of a \$5.4 billion Regional Transportation Improvement Program for 2023-2026 that was adopted by PSRC's Executive Board in October. Final approval by the Governor and federal funding agencies is expected in early 2023. This program includes a wide variety of investments over the next four years, addressing the needs of transit, state and local roadways, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, maintenance and preservation, and others.

Your project performed well in PSRC's merit-based project selection process, which identifies priority projects that will improve local and regional mobility and help achieve our long-range Regional Transportation Plan. Kudos to you and your staff for securing this funding.

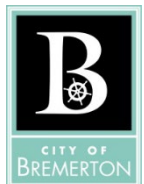
Thank you and your team for continuing to provide essential services to your community throughout the pandemic. I look forward to continuing to partner with you on efforts to help the region thrive for the long term.

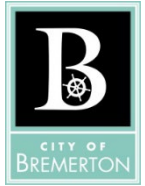

New Emergency Room Coming to Bremerton!



MultiCare to build new neighborhood emergency room in Bremerton
December 7, 2022

Dear Mayor Wheeler:

I am pleased to share with you that MultiCare Health System is building a new neighborhood emergency room in Bremerton. The Bremerton facility, which will operate under Tacoma General's license, is expected to break ground on construction in spring 2023.

MultiCare purchased 2.4 acres of property located at 5900 State Highway 303 NE, Bremerton, to construct a new 10,500-square-foot neighborhood emergency department. The new facility will feature 10 patient rooms, four observation rooms, on-site radiology services, including X-ray, ultrasound, and CT scans. It will be open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and staffed by board-certified emergency physicians.
