Mayor's 2023 Initiative:

Support STEM Coding Program at Marvin Williams Center for young learners

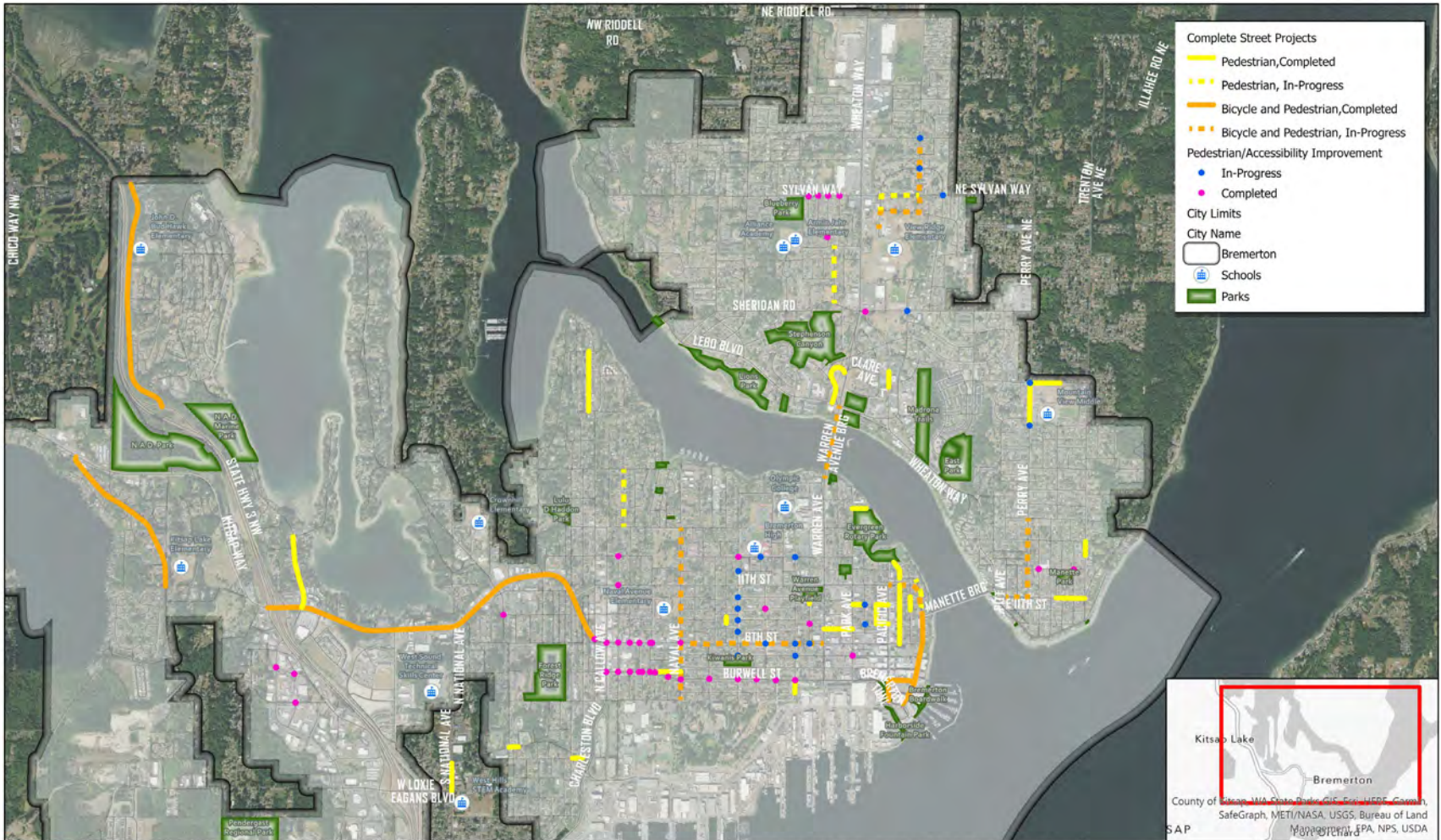
- City invested \$60,000 in the STEM and coding dojo program in fall 2022
- The program opened October 1, 2022 and will run through end of the 2023 academic school year
- Since October 2022 – January 2023, the program has provided 55 hours per month for afterschool and Saturday programming with a range of 8-30 students per session.

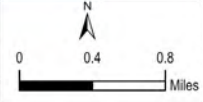
