Anderson Creek Dam Removals



This summer, the City removed two decommissioned dams on the east and west forks of Anderson Creek in coordination with the Suquamish Tribe.

- The dams have been in place for more than a century and have been a barrier to salmon spawning
- Dam removal has restored access to 1.2 miles of salmon spawning habitat
- The in-water work was completed in September, 1 month ahead of the fish window closure in plenty of time for this year's returning salmon runs.

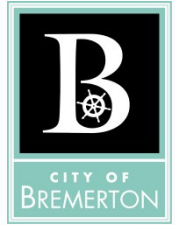

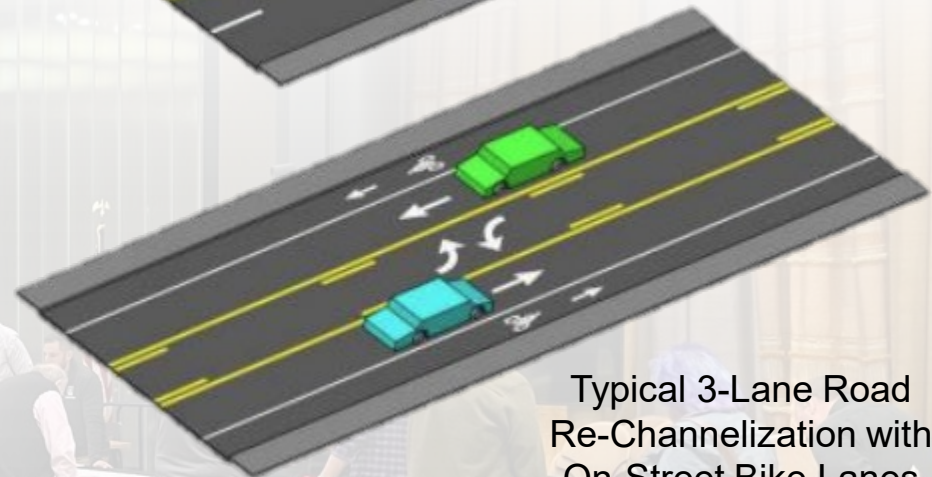
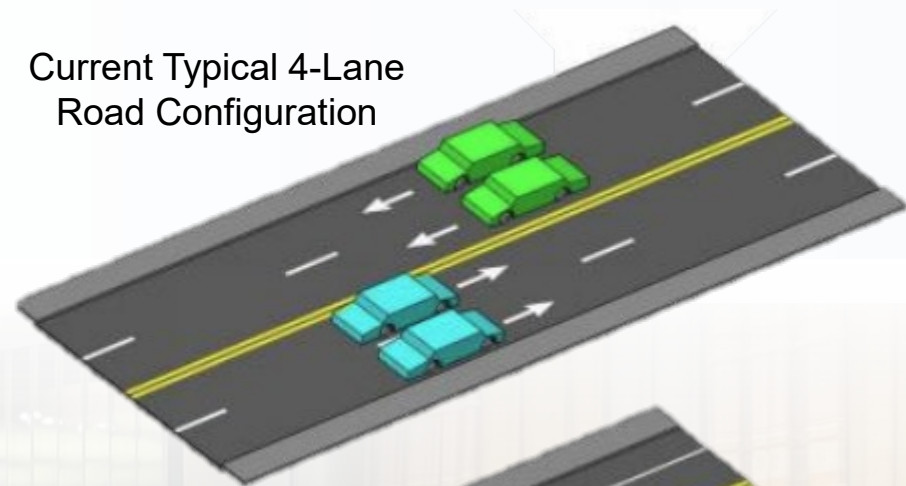
