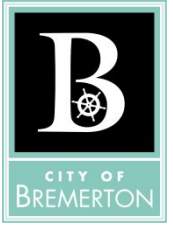

Downtown Hanging Baskets

- Parks and Recreation staff recently partnered with the local Bremerton Garden Club on planting flowers for the City's downtown hanging baskets. The local club shared their expertise on these efforts.
- Volunteers worked alongside staff to prepare and plant seasonal flowers that will be displayed in Bremerton beginning mid-spring.
- These hanging baskets enhance the beauty of the downtown corridor, support local pollinators, and contribute to a welcoming environment for residents, visitors, and local businesses.
- This partnership demonstrates how volunteer engagement continues to support beautification efforts across Bremerton.
- The baskets were prepped at the Parks and Recreation department greenhouses at Stephenson Canyon Park and will remain there until they are hung in the City.

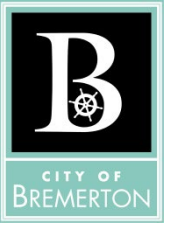


Accessibility Improvements at Lions Park

- Today, the Bremerton Central Lions Club charitable foundation awarded an accessibility grant of \$15,000 toward improvements at the tennis/pickleball courts at Lions Park
- The project and funding will eliminate slopes on the courts, provide accessible seating areas and adjust the courts to follow wheelchair pickleball guidelines for recreational play and tournaments
- This project was an identified priority at the park in the City's 2026 Parks, Recreation and Open Space (PROS Plan)
- An additional partner in the project includes the West Sound Pickleball Club
- City staff are seeking to secure additional funding through grants and donations to complete the project in 2026.



Central Bremerton Forcemain Replacement Project 1st Street Reconstruction



Project Status:

- Substantial Completion achieved in February
- Minor punch list items remain.

What Was Delivered:

- Central Bremerton Sewer Forcemain replacement.
- 1st Street reconstruction, from Naval Ave to Montgomery Ave

Community Benefit:

- New wastewater system to provide conveyance for downtown Bremerton and the east end of PSNS.
- Visible improvements to streets that provide investment in neighborhood livability.
- New 6' sidewalks and 5' bike lane.

Funding:

- 100% Grant funded through Federal program
