Joint City/Navy Traffic Study Update

- The City of Bremerton, with funding from the Department of Defense, is continuing to work on a detailed commuter traffic study – called the Joint Compatibility Transportation Plan (JCTP)
- Work is underway to evaluate options to address commuter traffic and parking issues related to the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in and around the City.
- A preferred alternative for solutions will be drafted and presented for public comment at a public meeting in early October
- Once public feedback is gathered, the preferred alternative will be refined and finalized.
- The final plan and report will be completed in early 2023
